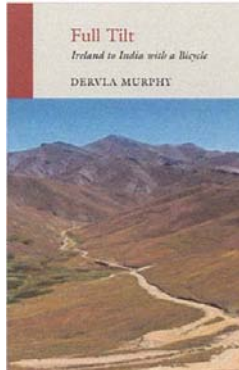

Dervla Murphy was born in Ireland in 1931. As a child, she always wanted to travel – but when she left school her parents needed her so she stayed at home in Ireland. She was a nurse for more than ten years. Then, **finally** she left Ireland for the first time.



Where did she go? How did she get there? On a bike! She cycled across Europe in the worst winter for years, through snow **storms** and floods, over the Himalaya mountains. It was very hot – sometimes 48° C. She met many friendly people and made a lot of friends. The 4,500 mile journey took 175 days and was often very dangerous. It was the beginning of a life of travelling.
