#### **BODY LANGUAGE**



When we communicate with others, we express our thoughts and feelings not only through the words we choose, but also through our tone of voice, facial expression and body language. In fact, many communication experts believe that far more information is communicated non-verbally than verbally. "Body language" is an important part of non-verbal communication.

Body language includes many different aspects of our everyday physical behaviour: the way we greet one another; how we stand, how we sit or walk; the way we position our arms and legs or use our hands and eyes

are some of the most basic ways of communicating a message.

Learning another language is more than just learning words and grammar; it involves learning about another culture, too. Body language is different from culture to culture, so it's something to which second language learners should pay attention. Sometimes, cultural differences in appropriate body language can cause anger or misunderstandings. For example, there are cultural differences in how much distance should be kept between two people who are speaking together.

Even speakers of the same language, such as British, American, or Australian people, may not use the same body language, and must adapt if they wish to communicate successfully. British people are said to be more reserved and serious, in general, and this is reflected in their body language. Americans are considered more open and outgoing, while Australians are seen as casual and relaxed.

Understanding basic cultural or regional attitudes can help us learn how to recognize and use body language to improve our communicative abilities.

Minecraft is not just a game - it's a way for players to be imaginative, learn in school, and use it in real life. Allowing people to produce whatever they want in an open world keeps them coming back for more.
