UN says extreme heat is the new normal

The United Nations weather agency has warned that extreme temperatures are "the new normal". Scientists **1. (blame / <u>claim</u> / proclaim)** that climate change is making heatwaves longer, hotter and more frequent.

In July 2023, many countries experienced **2. (rare / real / <u>record</u>)** hot weather. In parts of the USA and China, the mercury went over 50°C.
