B. Write any 10 'summer' words you know If you want, you can get some ideas from the picture below. (10x1,5= 15marks)

If the word is an easy/common one & wrongly spelt, thus distorting its meaning, then the student loses the whole 1,5 m. for this word: Examples: cea(sea) / hod (hot) / het (hat) / bal (ball) / flouer (flower) / bout (boat)etc.

BUT if the student has attempted longer or more difficult words, then he/she may lose 0,5 or 1m. depending on the spelling mistakes : Examples: The words beachbal / holidey / grasshoppers / sandcastl / strawberries / bagpak/ may get 1m

Unfortunately there's no rule for that,[e.g. how much do I give if there's 1 or 2 letters missing? and so on...] therefore, it should seriously be taken into consideration that fair marking will mostly depend on the marker's judgement.
