The history of Braille

Louis Braille was born in 1809 in a small town near Paris. Louis often played with the tools his father used in his workplace. When he was three years old, he had a terrible accident. (1) The doctor couldn't help him, and by the time he was four, Louis had become blind.



Louis started school when he was six. He was a clever boy but it was hard for him to study. (2) He could only listen to his teachers. There was a special school for blind children in Paris, and when Louis was 10 years old, his parents decided to send him there.

The new school was nice and the teachers were friendly and not very strict. There were special books with letters that pupils could feel with their fingers, but they were very hard to read. (3)
