**Passage 2**

**Four Noble Plants in Chinese Culture**

In ancient China, Plum blossoms, Orchids, Bamboo and Chrysanthemums are known as the four gentlemen because these plants' natural characteristics have something in common with human virtues.

**Plum blossoms**

Plum blossoms are cold-resistant plants that flower in early spring. They represent justice and they first appeared in art in around 960 A.D; at that time, the most famous painter was the Buddhist monk Zhong Ren who painted shades to give the painting a very active appearance.

**Orchids**

Grown in deep mountain valleys, orchid is one of the top ten well-known flowers in China. With delicate fragrance refreshing people's minds, and the elegant figures moving slightly in the wind, orchids symbolise Purity. This beautiful flower blossoms all year round depending on the variety and environment. Orchids became an important theme in painting by the greatest orchid painter Zheng Banqiao in Qing Dynasty in the 1760s.

**Bamboo**

In traditional Chinese culture, bamboo is a metaphor of strength and flexibility. Silently grown in faraway mountains, bamboo is very slim with joints on their stem. Many bamboos only flower once every 20 to 120 years and may die in part or completely after their blooming. Bamboo was introduced in poetry by the famous poet Sushi in the 11<sup>th</sup> century, who once wrote down “Rather eat without meat than live without bamboo” in his poem to express his deep love for bamboo.

**Chrysanthemums**

Planted as early as three thousand years ago, Chrysanthemum is a traditional flower loved by Chinese people. When nearly all the flowers die in late autumn only the chrysanthemums withstand the heavy frost and bloom energetically in bright colours. That’s probably why it represents Life and Rebirth. The famous poet Tao Yuanming praised this magnificent flower in his poems somewhere around the year 400 A.D.
