



Papanikola-Bakirtzi, D and Sophianou, C. *Aspects of Daily Life in the Village of Stroumbi during the First Half of the 20th Century.*

This study adopts a social anthropology approach and explores various aspects and parameters of household and family economy, such as living conditions—housing structure and equipment, dietary habits and food types, as well as daily activities, personal experiences, and lived realities. It also examines social and family relationships. The study documents the clothing and footwear of men, women, and children, tracing their evolution throughout the period under investigation. Mindfully avoiding oversimplifications and generalizations, the project follows the trajectory and expressions of village life, from tradition to modernization, and from a closed economy of self-sufficiency and recycling to an open economy of imported goods and increased consumption. The information is drawn from primary sources, including interviews with elderly residents, newspaper articles of the time related to the village and its activities, and rare documents such as dowry agreements, sales contracts, and lease agreements. A particularly valuable source of information—and a reliable form of documentation—is the collection of old photographs gathered during the research.
