



**Tymviou, A. *The Relations of Cyprus and Savoy over time through Archival Sources in the Turin State Archives.***

This research focuses on the long-standing relations between Savoy and Cyprus, utilizing primary sources from the State Archives of Turin and contributing to a deeper understanding of the complex historical ties and their evolution. The significance of this study is underscored by the lack of systematic examination of the Savoy-Cyprus relations through the archival materials held at the Turin State Archives. Of particular importance is the donation of the royal title of Cyprus by Queen Charlotte of Lusignan to the Duchy of Savoy, a pivotal event that highlights the intricate nature of these diplomatic and political connections.

To achieve the research objectives, methods such as critical document analysis, comparative analysis, and interpretative approaches are employed. Additionally, the study incorporates a comprehensive historical review, source analysis methodologies, and relevant theoretical frameworks pertaining to the political and social relations of the period. The types of data utilised include archival documents, correspondence, official decrees, and other primary archival materials, which are analysed to facilitate an accurate interpretation of the historical events and interstate relations.

Consequently, this ongoing research provides an innovative research approach by leveraging the specific archival material, thereby illuminating the political, economic, and social dimensions of these historical connections. Moreover, the analysis of the documents enables a nuanced understanding of Cyprus' position within the broader political and geopolitical context of the Early Modern Period.
