Australia bans social media

There is a big change online. Australia has banned children under 16 from using many social media sites. New laws say the under-16s cannot **1. (open / install / set)** accounts with famous sites like Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, X, and YouTube. It is the **2. (possibility / flexibility / responsibility)** of these companies to make sure their users are aged 16 or above. Australia said it would fine companies if they **3.
