Suggested Answers for Exercise 7 - Writing Plan

1. Introduction

- Start by explaining what AI is in a simple way.
- Mention that AI is becoming more common in education.
- Introduce the idea that some people worry about the negative effects.
- State your position (e.g. *I partly agree/ I disagree/ I agree*).
 - Example: Although AI has some negative effects in education, it can also be a powerful tool when used responsibly.

2. Body Paragraph 1- AI can contribute to teaching (positive effect)

- Explain how AI helps teachers and students.

- Possible points:
 - AI can personalize learning (adapts to student's level).
 - Helps teachers with grading or planning lessons.
 - Provides extra support for students who need help.
- Give a short example:
 - e.g. AI tutoring programs can explain difficult math problems step-by-step.

3. Body Paragraph 2- AI is used for cheating (negative effect)

- Explain how students might misuse AI.
- Possible points:
 - Students may use AI to write essays or do homework without learning.
 - Makes it harder for teachers to know if the work is original.
 - Could reduce students' critical-thinking and writing skills.
- Add a small example:
 - e.g. Some students submit AI-generated assignments, which leads to unfair academic results.

4. Body Paragraph 3- Your own idea

Choose one perspective of your own. Examples:

- **Idea 1: AI can increase inequality.**
Not all students have equal access to technology.
- **Idea 2: AI can improve creativity if used properly.**
It can help students brainstorm ideas, learn languages, or practice skills.
- **Idea 3: AI could replace some traditional learning tasks.**
This might reduce human interaction, which is important in education.

5. Conclusion

- Summarize the main points (AI helps teaching, AI can encourage cheating, your own idea).
- Restate your opinion (the one used in the introduction).
- End with a final thought:
 - e.g. AI is neither good nor bad; its impact depends on how students and schools choose to use it.

I'm doing a project at college about how people use the internet these days. I know you enjoy using the Internet more than I do so I hope you can help! How has the Internet changed the way you do things? What is your favourite website? What makes this website useful?

Write your **email**.

Suggested Answers for exercise 8A – Informal email writing

1. Greeting

- Start with a friendly greeting.
 - Example: “Hi [Friend’s Name], thanks for your email!”

2. Acknowledge the Project

- Mention that you’re happy to help with his/her college project.
 - Example: “Your project sounds really interesting, and I’d be glad to help.”

3. Answer the first question: How has the internet changed the way you do things?

- Mention 2-3 ways the internet has changed your daily life.
 - e.g. -Studying (online research, videos, articles)
 - Communication (messaging, social media, video calls)
 - Shopping (buying things online)
 - Entertainment (streaming music, movies)
- > Students are expected to give brief examples for each.

4. Answer the second and third questions: What is your favourite website? What makes this website useful?

- State your favourite website.
- Give a short explanation **why** it is your favourite.
 - Example: “My favourite website is YouTube because I can learn new things, watch tutorials and relax with entertainment

5. Closing

- Offer to answer more questions if needed.
- End warmly.
 - Example: “I hope this helps with your project. Let me know if you need anything else!

8B - You see this announcement in your college English-language magazine.

More and more teenagers are victims of bullying at school.

Write an article in which you:

- Explain the problem.
- Suggest ways to prevent bullying.

Write your article. Use 140-180 words.

Suggested Answers for exercise 8B – Article Writing

1. Introduction

- Introduce the issue of increasing bullying among teenagers.
- Mention why it is a serious concern (mental health, academic performance, safety).

2. Body Paragraph 1-Present the Problem

- Describe the different forms of bullying (physical, verbal, cyberbullying, social exclusion).
- Explain the impact on victims (stress, depression, low self-esteem, skipping school).
- Include real-world context: bullying happens both inside school and online.
- Mention that many teens remain silent due to fear or embarrassment.

3. Body Paragraph 2- Suggest Ways to Prevent Bullying

- Role of schools:
 - Anti-bullying policies
 - More supervision in corridors, playgrounds and online platforms
 - Anonymous reporting systems
- Role of teachers:
 - Training to identify early signs of bullying
 - Encouraging open communication with students
- Role of parents:
 - Monitoring behaviour changes
 - Teaching empathy and respect at home
- Role of students:
 - Speaking up, supporting victims
 - Creating a culture of kindness and inclusion

4. Conclusion

- Restate the seriousness of the issue.
- Emphasise that preventing bullying requires cooperation from everyone.
- End with a call to action for creating safer schools.

8C

A teen magazine wants its readers to send in stories that begin with:

“It was a dark and stormy night. John was on his way home.”

Write your story. Use 140-180 words.

Suggested Answers for exercise 8C – Story Writing

The candidate is expected **to write a story** for the teen magazine.

- S/He **should** start her/his story with the given sentence.

-S/He **should** use a variety of narrative tenses. (Past Simple/Past Continuous/Past Perfect Simple/Past Perfect Continuous)

-S/He **should** include a variety of connectors to link opposing and contrasting ideas.

1. Paragraph 1: Introduction-Opening Scene-Establish Mood & Tension

- Use vivid sensory details to expand on the storm: thunder, flickering streetlights, wind pushing against John.
- Show John’s emotional state: Is he nervous? / Tired? / Preoccupied?

- Introduce why he's out in such bad weather at night- Try to provide context about John (job-personality traits) works late shifts at work, whether he was visiting someone that night or fleeing something.
- What "home" means to him? (safe place? / troubled family life? / lonely apartment?)

2. Main Body-Paragraph 2- Something interrupts the journey

Possible answers:

-A sudden obstacle: fallen tree, abandoned car, washed-out bridge.

-A mysterious figure: someone waving for help, a silhouette crossing the road.

-An unexpected event: John finds a strange object, his car loses power, or hears a scream.

This moment should force John to make a decision-rescue someone, confront the threat, escape danger or reveal the truth.

3. Main Body-Paragraph 3- Rising Action-John navigates the problem

- John investigates or tries to avoid the strange event.
- Introduce secondary characters if needed: a stranded driver, a police officer, a child, a creature.
- Show increasing stakes: worsening storm, limited visibility, dwindling phone battery, time pressure.
- Reveal hints about a larger mystery: footprints, a warning, a message, a clue.

4. Falling action-Resolution

- Show the immediate aftermath. (Does the storm break? / Is anyone hurt? / Was the mystery solved?)
- John reaches home- physically or metaphorically
- Show how the experience changed him.
- End with a final mood: melancholy, reflection, hope, or an eerie hint that the story isn't fully over.
