Turkey Tetrazzini

Preheat the oven to 180° C. Oil a large ovenproof dish. Bring a large saucepan of lightly 1. salted water to the boil. Add the tagliatelle and cook for about 10 minutes. 2. Drain well and reserve. In a heavy-based saucepan, 3. heat the butter and add the bacon. Cook until 4. crispy and golden. Add the onion and mushrooms and cook until the vegetables are 5. tender. Stir in the flour and cook for two minutes. Remove from the heat and slowly stir in the stock. Return to the heat and cook, stirring until a 6. smooth thick sauce has formed. Add the tagliatelle, then 7. pour in the cream and sherry. Add the turkey and parsley. Season to 8. taste with the nutmeg and salt and pepper. Toss well to coat. Pour the mixture into the prepared dish, 9. spreading evenly. Sprinkle the top with parmesan cheese and 10. bake in the preheated oven for about 30 minutes. Garnish with chopped parsley.
