

Japan's most famous dog



In front of the enormous Shibuya train station in Tokyo, there is a life-size statue of an Akita dog. Even though the statue is very small when compared to the huge flashing signs, it is not difficult to find. It has been used as a meeting point since 1934 and today you will find hundreds of people waiting there

for their friends or just stopping by to take some photos.

Hachiko, an Akita dog, was born in 1923 and brought to Tokyo in 1924. His owner, Professor Eisaburo Uyeno and Hachiko were best friends right from the start. Every morning Hachiko accompanied his owner, who was a professor at the Imperial University, to Shibuya train station, where he got on the train to get to work. When he came back, the professor always found the dog patiently waiting for him at the train station, where he had left him. Sadly, the professor died suddenly at work in 1925 before he could return home.

Although Hachiko was still a young dog, the friendship between him and his owner was very strong and he continued to wait at the station every day. Sometimes, he would stay there for days at a time, though some people believe that he continued going back because of the food he was given by the passengers. Hachiko became a familiar sight to the citizens of Shibuya over time. In 1934, a statue of him was put outside the station. In 1935, Hachiko died at the train station, the place where he last saw his friend alive. The dog became famous not only all over Japan, but also all over the world and he symbolizes real friendship and loyalty. His story inspired many people and it was made into a film in 2009.
