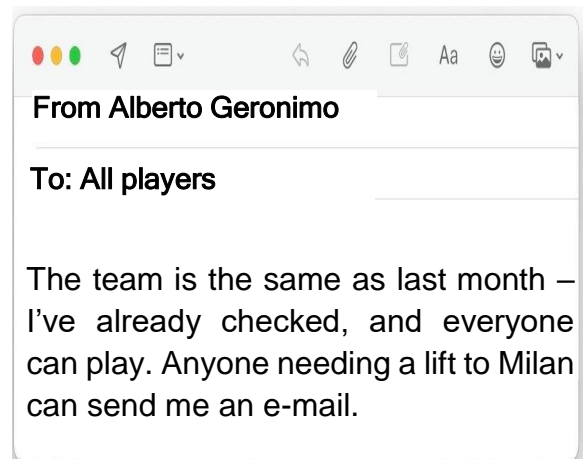

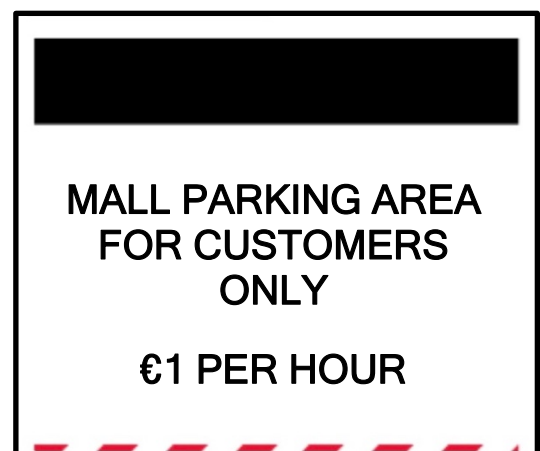

The Rosetta Project



There are currently 7000 spoken languages but at least 3000 tongues are endangered, seriously endangered or dying out in parts of the world. The Votian language, which is very close to the Estonian language, is about to become extinct because only 50 adult speakers know the language. Experts generally consider a community's language to be "endangered" when at least 30 per cent of its youngsters no longer learn it. As is the case with Votian, when no young people learn a language as their mother tongue, the language dies out.

Language extinction is a major concern for many experts and for this reason they have created a project called the 'Rosetta Project'. The project makes a digital record of all human languages in an effort to keep languages alive. This digital library will be a great tool for the future because it can help experts to recover lost languages. Another aim of the Rosetta Project is to help people find documents of long-gone languages and, why not even, rediscover them.

The Rosetta disk will have 13000 pages of information on over 1500 languages and it is considered as a journey between cultures and history. For each language there is going to be data on its people, writing systems, grammar and vocabulary. The project will make use of translated versions of texts into a number of languages to make sure no language will disappear with no evidence. There are going to be translated texts of endangered languages too.

The name Rosetta comes from the ancient 'Rosetta Stone' which was discovered in 1799 in Egypt, near the town of Rashid (Rosetta) in the Nile River Delta. The original Rosetta stone was a tablet written in hieroglyphic symbols and the Egyptian and Greek languages. Because Greek was well known, the stone was the key to reading the hieroglyphics and for this reason its discovery helped unlock the secrets of an ancient civilisation, bringing back to life a writing system which died out in the 4th century.

Unfortunately, people abandon their native language for many reasons. English, for example, is quickly becoming a universal language; it is the one language that is spoken and understood by the majority of the population in almost every region of the world and many scientific and business documents are written in English. This can easily make some dialects or languages disappear faster. For some, having fewer languages is better because we can have better communication. However, we should keep in mind that losing a language means losing a culture.

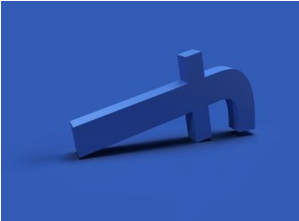

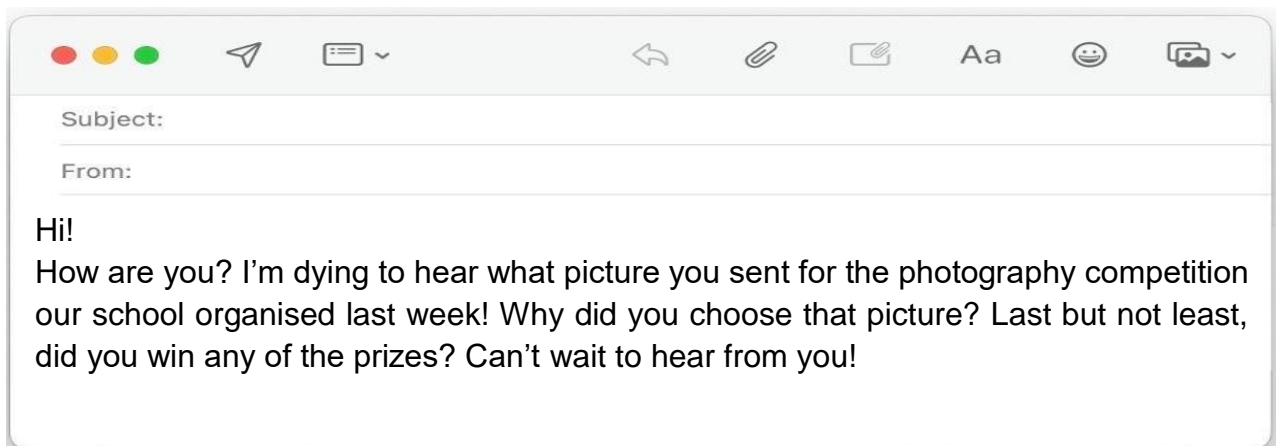

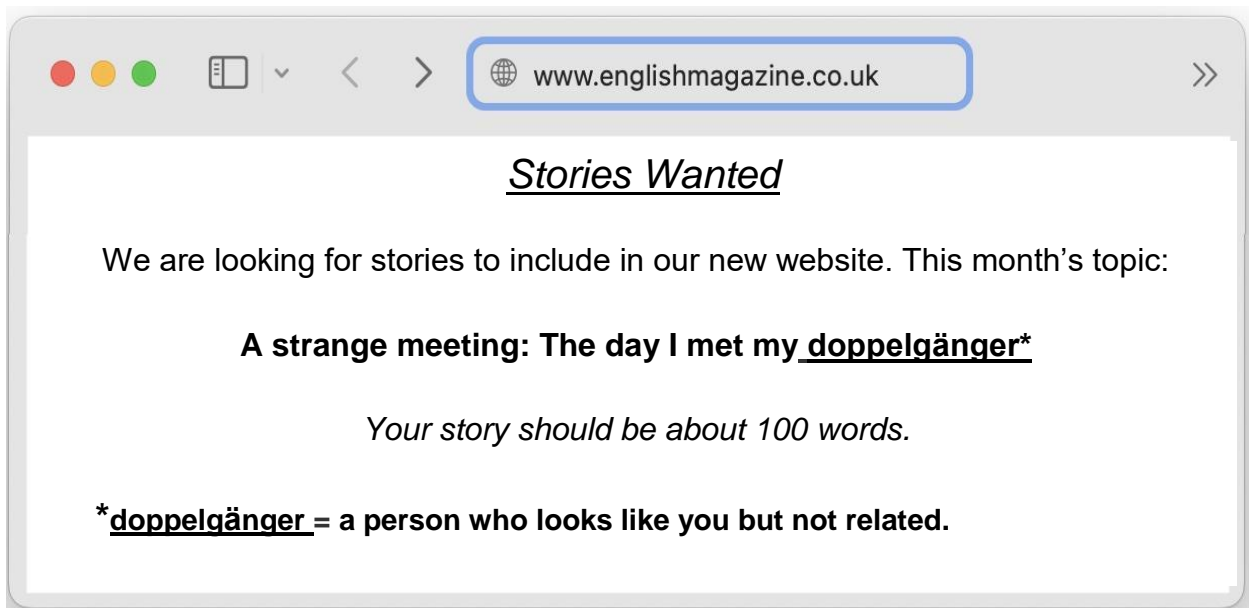
