

Old technology is coming back

Despite the incredible growth of online streaming platforms like Spotify and Apple Music over the past 15 years, a more traditional way of listening to music has also seen a rebirth in

interest and sales in the music industry. Vinyls were largely left behind when cassette tapes, then CDs, then MP3 players, then digital streaming came on the scene. Surprisingly, last year records were more profitable than CDs for the first time in 30 years.

According to statistics, 80 per cent of people in the UK choose streaming for listening to music. Despite the incredible growth of online streaming platforms, there has been a renewed interest in a more traditional medium. Sales of vinyl records saw a growth in 2020, and almost one in five of all albums purchased in the UK is now vinyl. While vinyl records have for some time been linked to middle-aged people, new research shows that, amazingly enough, the main reason behind this vinyl revival is actually younger consumers. Around half of those buying vinyl these days are under 35, and young people are leading the modern rebirth of this traditional medium.

Despite the fact that technology has revolutionized the music industry, there's an element of fascination to the vinyl in general. Although we have an almost endless supply of music at our fingertips through online streaming platforms, vinyl records have made a comeback primarily because vinyl is a physical media for experiencing music, something tangible to hold and own. The nature of streaming is short-lived: we buy access to music... we don't actually own it. In some ways, listening to an album is a journey, and experiencing it the way the artist intended can make us feel more connected to the music and the artist. Vinyl records are typically more expensive than CDs or digital downloads, but many believe they are worth the extra cost.

Sound quality is another <u>hot topic</u> when it comes to vinyl records. A lot of music enthusiasts feel that the sound vinyl offers is superior to modern digital audio. There's a common belief that old-school audio has a warmer, fuller sound that makes the music seem more personal and real. This is because music audios are compressed (reduced in size) to upload as many as possible.

With vinyls, music becomes an activity that you take part in rather than just background noise. It's clear that vinyl records are truly making a comeback. In an increasingly digital society, there's something to be said for similar experiences. Perhaps one of the great things about being alive in the 21st century is our ability to have the best of both worlds—the timeless appeal of tangible, physical records alongside huge music libraries that streaming offers.




