THINGS YOU SHOULD NOT DO WHEN TRAVELLING



Travelling can be a wonderful life experience, but to make the most of it, travellers should consider some important factors before leaving home.

Good travellers should respect the places they visit. They should know about the appropriate dress code, especially when visiting religious sites. Avoid asking the local people about historic events such as wars. What may be a fascinating topic to you could be painful for a local

resident. It's also best to avoid criticising political or religious matters.

Besides respecting the people, a good traveller respects the place. Dropping food at historic and natural sites can cause pollution, so make sure your visit has as little negative impact as possible.

A good traveller is well-prepared in advance. Researching the history and culture of the destination country and even some of the language before you travel is a good idea. Try to learn some basic, essential words of the local vocabulary, especially for 'please', 'excuse me' and 'thank you'. English is an international language, but that doesn't mean you shouldn't make an effort.

Pre-travel checklist

It's always a good idea to visit your doctor before taking a trip in order to make sure you have any medicine you need, and to ask him/her any other questions you may have. Depending on what country you are going to, you may also want to get certain vaccinations.

Check the weather at your destination country in advance. This way, you will have no trouble deciding what pieces of clothing are necessary.
