Penguins



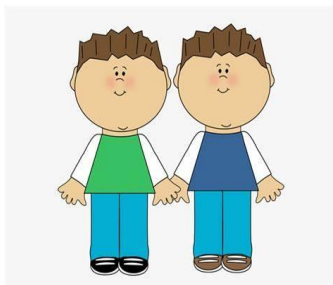

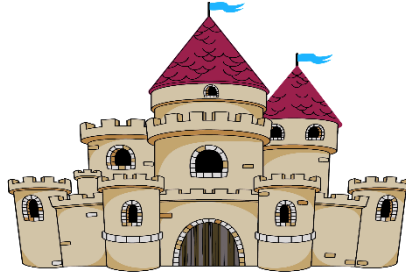
In the afternoon, they often study Science, Art and Geography. Sometimes they go on school trips to a zoo or a farm because all the children in the class love animals.
