How to tell what someone is like from their handwriting

It's no surprise that you can learn a lot about someone based on what they write. However, did you know that you can learn just as much about them based on how they write? A person's handwriting can actually provide an in-depth look into their personality. Although Graphology, or handwriting analysis, claims to **reveal** people's personalities, the science is very doubtful. Graphologists believe that the analysis of handwriting gives information about personality, psychological states and medical condition.

Look at the size of the letters

This is the first, and most basic, observation you can make about someone's handwriting. Large letters are a sign that someone is **outgoing**, sociable, and may like being the centre of attention. However, it can also indicate false confidence and a desire to be something they're not. Small letters can mean someone is more shy. Small letters can also indicate intense focus. Average size letters mean the person is well-adjusted and **adaptable**.

Examine the gaps between words and letters

Words that are placed together tightly indicate that the person dislikes being alone. They probably choose to be around people as much as possible, and find it difficult to respect one's personal space. If they use wide spaces between words and letters, they enjoy independence and value their freedom.

Check out the margins of the page

Did they write all over, or did they leave spaces around the edges? If they left a larger margin on the left side of the page, they may be someone who dwells in the past. On the other hand, those who leave spaces on the right hand margin may worry too much about the future, and get **anxiety** thinking about what's ahead. A person who writes all over the page is probably a bit spastic, with a racing mind.

Determine how much pressure they used to write

You can figure this out by the darkness and intensity of the ink on the page, or by turning the paper over and seeing if there are marks from the pen. Handwriting with heavy pressure indicates you have strong **emotions** and are quick to react, while light pressure implies an easiness and ability to move from place to place.

Inspect the signature

Signatures are not always readable. When a signature cannot be read clearly, it means that the person is introvert. A readable signature indicates that the person is more self-confident and happy with themselves. A quickly scrawled signature may mean that the person is impatient. A careful signature can show that the signer is precise and independent. According to graphologists, a signature shows who a person wants to be and how they want to appear to the outside world. The signature is an advertisement for how one wants to be seen.
