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# Address by the Minister of Education and Culture

It is with great satisfaction that I welcome this year's online edition of music partnerships between the Ministry of Education and Culture and other cultural and educational institutions and organisations. This is an ongoing initiative taking place for the seventh consecutive year and it is realised through a series of remarkable musical actions implemented with the participation of a large number of students and the cooperation of major cultural institutions.

In the context of the recent educational reform, the Ministry of Education and Culture acknowledges the importance of an educational policy that promotes the values and ideals of humanistic education, considering the contribution of culture as particularly important. To this end, a key aspect of the educational reform has been the expansion of the institution of the Music School in lower secondary schools in all five regions in Cyprus. During the last ten years, the Music Schools institution has offered the opportunity for children with a special interest in music to develop their musical talent, to broaden their musical training and to further cultivate their musical education. The educational programme applied to Music Schools includes partnerships with agencies such as the Cyprus Symphony Orchestra Foundation, municipalities, communities and established artists from Cyprus and abroad.

Moreover, the Ministry offers, in collaboration with other cultural agents, a number of additional programmes aimed at children with a particular interest in music, such as the regional student orchestras in Nicosia and Pafos and a new wind instrument workshop inaugurated this year at schools of the Municipalities of Engomi and Avios Dometios.

At the same time, ongoing partnerships with cultural agencies such as the Cyprus Symphony Orchestra Foundation, the Pharos Arts Foundation, the Photos Photiades Cultural Foundation, OPAP Cyprus, etc. continue to offer music education programmes to as many students as possible reaching all schools in Cyprus. Programmes offered include educational concerts, open rehearsals, master classes, seminars and annual musical actions such as the choir workshop and concert, the *Musical Vibes* concert and the student composition contest Marios Tokas - Kostas Montis.

The continuous enhancement and growth of musical partnerships proves that effective interaction between cultural institutions, the cost-effective use of existing resources and the possibilities of modern technology can promote the further development of music education in our country.

The Ministry of Education and Culture recognises and commends the Music Partneships between Education and Culture presented in this year's edition and we confirm our willingness to continue investing in the cultural development of our country's young generation.

- To develop a positive attitude towards music in an intercultural context.
- To enhance innovative entrepreneurship by contributing to the personal and professional development of musicians.

### J. Participation at the 3rd International Music Olympiad

The three contestants, Savvas Chrysostomou, Maria Christina Tsiakourma and Stella Helen Konstantinidou, were awarded a bronze medal for their performance after competing in music listening and theory related tasks, sight singing/playing, performing a song and performing an original composition. The student Savvas Chrysostomou also got the special award for best song performance.
