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Address by the Minister of Education and Culture

The annual publication of "Partnerships between Education and Culture" demonstrates what has been achieved by the Secondary Education Service of the Ministry of Education and Culture, in cooperation with agencies and cultural institutions in Cyprus. It is with great pleasure that I address the current publication, which exemplifies the qualitative and creative ways of promoting music education in Cyprus.

Music, as a school subject, contributes in a particular manner and a holistic way both to the cognitive and social emotional development of students. Through experiences that help develop their skills, knowledge, attitudes and values in life, children are encouraged to experience music as listeners, performers and composers, establishing a lifelong learning relationship with music.

A fundamental innovation in music education in Cyprus has been the establishment of five Music Lyceums, one in each district in Cyprus. The establishment of Music Schools has been warmly welcomed by the Cypriot society, and the aforementioned institutions have been assessed as successful in becoming music educational as well as cultural points of reference.

The educational music programmes for Secondary Education in Cyprus are innovations that promote active and creative participation of young people in the social, political, cultural and economic life. These are carried out in cooperation with cultural institutions and other agencies, thus enabling their realisation through sharing of the financial burden, and at the same time enhancing interaction between school and society.

This year's partnerships include important musical activities, such as concerts and open rehearsals offered by the Cyprus Symphony Orchestra and other renowned artists from abroad, choir workshops with distinguished Cypriot choir conductors and the annual Secondary and Higher Education students' concert "Musical Vibes". Music groups from all five Music Lyceums participated in various music events and concerts in collaboration with prominent artists. A concert was organised by the Limassol Music Lyceum with Music Schools from the Czech Republic and Poland and the Cyprus Youth Symphony Orchestra, a partnership initiated in the context of European programmes. Moreover, the Nicosia Regional Orchestra continued to present concerts all over the island in collaboration with municipalities and communities. Finally, the annual "Music Composition Contest" was organised with success.

The musical activities presented in the 2013-2014 annual report show that, despite economic and other difficulties experienced, education in Cyprus continues to invest in young persons' cultural development. As the Minister of Education and Culture, I welcome and support such collaborations between Education and Culture, which aim at developing cultural awareness and expression.

C1. Partnerships between students and teachers of the Music Schools and distinguished artists

- The choir of the Lefkosia Music Lyceum collaborated with the Cyprus Youth Symphony Orchestra for the concert "Mozart: the history of a legend who has marked the history of music". The concert, which was presented within the framework of the International Festival KYPRIA 2013, took place on 3 September 2014.
- The choirs of the Lefkosia and Lemesos Music Lycea collaborated with the Cyprus Symphony Orchestra for the Concert for the Cyprus Independence Day. The concert, which was presented within the framework of the International Festival KYPRIA 2013, took place on 2 October and 3 October 2013 in Lefkosia and Lemesos.
- The Lefkosia and Lemesos Music Lycea took part in a music concert celebrating the 60th year anniversary of OELMEK, which took place on 4 March 2014.

The "Music Composition Annual Contest" was held in December 2013, within the framework of the cooperation between the Ministry of Education and Culture, the non-profit «Photos Photiades» Foundation and the Cyprus Broadcasting Corporation, with the participation of Lyceum students from all over Cyprus.

Three composition contests are part of the "Music Composition Annual Contest":

- The 5th "Marios Tokas" songwriting contest, commemorating the Cypriot composer Marios Tokas
- The 3rd "Costas Montis" songwriting contest, based on lyrics by the renowned Cypriot poet
- The 1st Instrumental Composition Contest, a new contest that was inaugurated in 2013

The regional contests took place on December 2 and 4, 2013 and the final contest took place on December 12, 2013.

F. Partnerships between the Lycea Regional Orchestra, Public and Private Secondary Education Schools, the Music Lyceum of Lefkosia, the Music Lyceum of Pafos, the European University of Cyprus, the Strovolos Municipality, the Pafos Municipality and the Cyprus Tourism Organisation

The establishment of the Lycea Regional Orchestra is another innovation of the Ministry of Education and Culture, which has been implemented in Secondary Education, by a decision of the Council of Ministers in November 2003. Music teachers who are specialised in orchestral conducting have been appointed as conductors and the orchestra is open to all students through audition. The aim of such activities is to offer young people the opportunity for enhance creativity and communication skills, create incentives for qualitative music performance and develop Music and Aesthetic Education. The repertoire varies accordingly, from classical to Cypriot and Greek, as well as students' compositions.

- Concert at the Dianellou and Theodotou Gymnasium with the collaboration of the Parents' Committee, on March 8 2014. The concert was organised aiming to help impoverished families.
- Concert at the Tseriou Primary School with the collaboration of the Parents' Committee, on March 15 2014.
- Concert at the Tamasos Primary School with the collaboration of the Parents' Committee, on March 8 2014. The concert was organised aiming at helping impoverished families.
- 5th Music Camp in Pafos in collaboration with the Pafos Music Lyceum and presentation of a final concert on April 5 2014, aiming to help impoverished families.

- Enrichment of the lives of everyone involved, through the development of aesthetic education
- Contribution to the personal and professional development of musicians

Aims and targets not copleted

• Extension of the Music School to the Gymnasium-cycle

- Establishment of rules for the Music School
- Establishment of rules and credibility to the Certificate of Musical Studies
- Programme evaluation (partial implementation because of insufficient funding)
- Digital presentation of the programmes (partial implementation)
- Establishment of rules for the programmes, so as to be offered to all students among Cyprus (insufficient funding)
- Open school (insufficient funding)
- All day school (insufficient funding)

Future aim

Systematic evaluation to support feedback in order to drive stakeholders to provide such programmes for all secondary school students, 43.340 during the school year 2013-2014, on an equal basis.

Objectives: The need

- to find ways that integrate successful projects in a structured system
- to ensure the necessary scale (towards universal accessibility) and sustainability (continuity and viability are considered prerequisites for consolidated results)
- to invest in synergies between cultural agencies and education organisations, from simple exchange of information and routine actions (the lowest level) to the most complicated events, where all partners contribute to the content and the materialisation of the above programmes, bearing equal responsibility as to the process and the result as well as to the sharing of expenditure.
