She Fell 10,000 Feet, and Walked Away

On the morning after Juliane Koepcke fell to earth, she awoke in the deep jungle of the Peruvian rainforest. Just before noon on Christmas Eve 1971, Juliane, then 17, and her mother had boarded a flight from Lima to Pucallpa. Her final destination was Panguana, a biological research station.



The flight was supposed to last less than an hour. About 25 minutes after take-off, the plane flew into a **thunderstorm** and began to shake. From a window seat in the back row, Juliane watched a bolt of lightning **strike** the plane's right wing. She remembers the aircraft nose-diving and her mother saying, "Now it's all over." People were crying and screaming. The aircraft had broken apart. "The next thing I knew, I was no longer inside the cabin," Juliane said. "I was outside, in the open air".

During her fall Juliane **blacked out**, only to wake up on land and see that she had fallen some 10,000 feet. She was strapped on her seat that had landed in dense vegetation, softening the fall. Juliane was the sole **survivor** of the crash.

Surprisingly, her injuries were minor: She broke a collarbone, sprained her knee, and had a swollen eye shut that didn't allow her to see well. She laid there for the rest of the day and night, until the next morning.

The next morning she woke up to the calls of birds, the croaks of frogs and the buzzing of insects. She recognised the sounds of wildlife and realised she was in the jungle and had survived the crash. In shock, and with only a small bag of candy to eat, she started her way through the dangerous Amazon jungle: She had to endure poisonous snakes, spiders, bees, extreme heat and hunger.

It was the middle of the rainy season, so there was no fruit to eat. River water provided what little nourishment Juliane received. For 9 days, despite the humidity and heat, she walked and swam. On day ten she **came across** a small hut with a palm-leaf roof. She took care of her wounds and decided to spend the night there. The next day, local Peruvian fishermen were shocked to find the blonde skinny girl. They took her to a nearby village, where she was airlifted to hospital.
